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Suggested discussion questions for this session include:

- What might a contemporary definition of "scholarly publishing" look like?
- When examining your own campus, what elements hinder innovation in publishing? Are there currently strategies to encourage and reward alternative models for sharing research results?
- Brainstorm some ideas for rewarding new approaches to non-commercial rights to research results. What can be done at the university level? At the college or departmental level?
- What is your campus doing to raise awareness about the impact of legacy publishing models? Are alternatives under consideration? What incentives have been offered to those who choose alternative approaches to sharing their content? Has the campus developed a repository for those who wish to make their non-commercial content available using Open Access?
- Are faculty and staff on your campus familiar with the options presented by the Creative Commons?
- How might professionals from IT, the Library and the Teaching faculty collaborate on such a project?
